Moving forward, our focus remains on strengthening the systems and support that help communities not only recover but continue rebuilding with stability

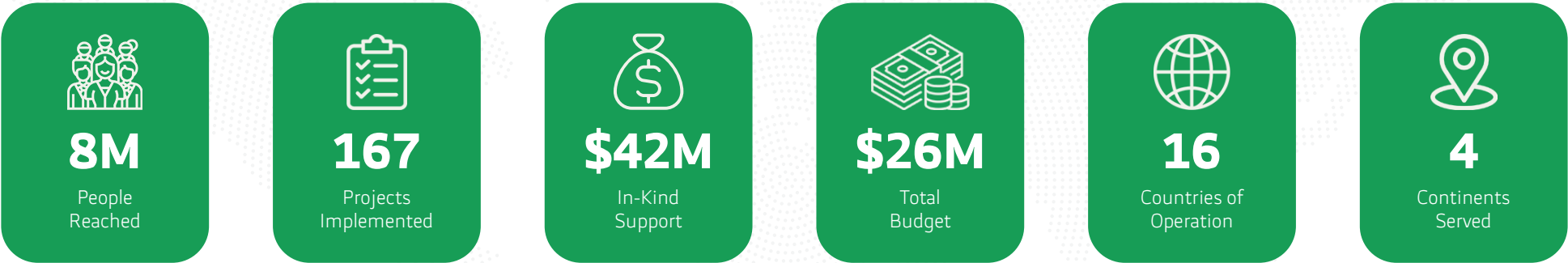

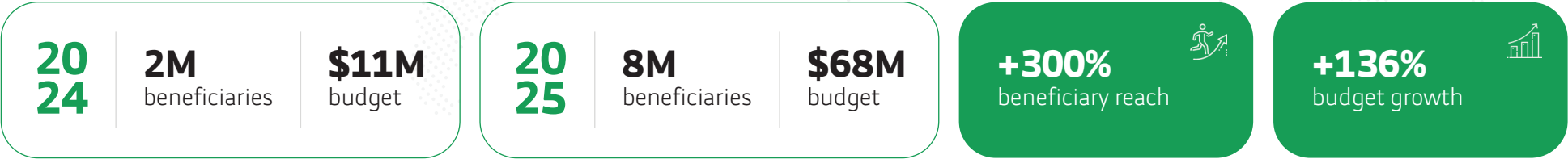
A YEAR THAT EXPANDED IMPACT

A year of expanded reach, stronger response, and sustained impact.



THE GROWTH

In 2025, Mercy Without Limits exponentially expanded its operational reach and budget for a wider reach and stronger operational capacity.



EXPANDED GLOBAL REACH

In 2025, Mercy Without Limits operated across **16 countries, in 4 continents** delivering multi-sector humanitarian programs in varying contexts shaped by conflict, displacement, economic hardship, and recovery needs.

The organization maintained a consistent presence in regions where support is both urgent and ongoing.

Context-Driven Response

Mercy Without Limits implemented 167 multi-sector projects in 2025, benefitting 8 million lives. The programs were designed with variability in mind – adapted to local realities across each country of operation; ensuring the interventions are responsive to the realities on the ground.

The **reach is not random or incidental**, but strategic. It reflects a deliberate approach to engage in environments where humanitarian needs require both immediate response and sustained intervention.

The MWL 2025 programs addressed urgent needs while supporting longer-term stability across interconnected sectors.



EMERGENCY RESPONSE INTERVENTIONS

When conditions shift rapidly, response must be immediate, coordinated, and reliable.

In 2025, Mercy Without Limits responded to **multiple emergencies** across regions affected by conflict, natural disasters, and displacement.

From wildfires in the United States to floods in Sri Lanka, and ongoing crises in Gaza, Lebanon, and Syria, interventions were structured to ensure **immediate assistance** connects to longer-term recovery.

Emergency response remained grounded in speed and access, ensuring that essential assistance reached communities at **critical moments**.

In every emergency context, the priority remained clear: **Reducing disruption and enabling communities to stabilize more effectively after the initial response phase.**

Geographic Response Highlights



United States

Support provided to communities affected by wildfires through the distribution of food, water, and hygiene supplies (Los Angeles).



Sri Lanka

Emergency relief delivered to flood-affected populations, including food packs and essential hygiene items.



Gaza

Distribution of tents and food to displaced families facing acute shortages and unstable living conditions.



Lebanon

Provision of non-food items, including mattresses and blankets, supporting vulnerable households during periods of heightened need.



Syria

Continued response through a combination of immediate relief and early recovery efforts, maintaining operational continuity in a complex and evolving context.



KEY RESPONSE ACTIONS

A shift from isolated response to integrated support; each action contributing to a broader pathway toward recovery.

Emergency response extended beyond material aid to include critical protection services:

Psychological First Aid (PFA) and psychosocial support sessions

Awareness initiatives on safety and risk mitigation

Legal counseling and referral support for vulnerable individuals

Distribution of dignity kits, elderly kits, and specialized assistance items

Support for individuals with specific needs, including mobility assistance

MULTISECTOR INTERVENTIONS

FROM RESPONSE TO RECOVERY

In humanitarian contexts, needs do not end when immediate assistance is delivered. They evolve.

In 2025, Mercy Without Limits continued to operate across this continuum, striving to ensure **support extended beyond response** into recovery and stabilization.

Emergency interventions were followed by efforts to **restore infrastructure, support livelihoods, and rebuild systems** that communities rely on daily.

The approach reflects a deliberate shift from isolated interventions toward integrated programming, where each phase of support connects to the next.

Linking relief efforts to recovery programs, Mercy Without Limits supports communities in moving from dependence toward stability, and from instability toward resilience.



MULTISECTOR INTERVENTIONS

TOWARDS SUSTAINING THE IMPACT

Food security, shelter, healthcare, and livelihoods all intersect in how communities experience daily life and rebuild beyond crisis.

Through the year, MWL implemented multi-sector interventions designed to respond across these interconnected realities. From **immediate assistance** to system rehabilitation and recovery-focused programming, each sector contributed to a broader approach **centered on continuity, dignity, and sustained impact.**

The following sections reflect how this work translated across sectors, geographies, and communities throughout the year.



MULTISECTOR INTERVENTIONS

PROTECTION & ORPHAN SUPPORT

In many of the contexts where Mercy Without Limits operates, vulnerability is ongoing, shaped by displacement, instability, and prolonged uncertainty.

The 2025 MWL protection programs focused on ensuring that individuals, particularly children and vulnerable groups, are supported through structured, consistent interventions that address both immediate and long-term needs.

This included a combination of direct assistance, awareness, case management, and psychosocial support, all designed to strengthen individual well-being while reinforcing community-level.



ORPHAN SUPPORT PROGRAMS

Orphan support remains a core pillar of MWL’s work, addressing immediate needs and ensuring term stability and development.

PROTECTION & ORPHAN SUPPORT

The interventions were delivered through coordinated systems, ensuring continuity of care, and enabling individuals to access support consistently over time.

The programs are designed to provide consistency in care, ensuring children have access to essential resources while building a sense of normalcy in their daily lives.

MULTISECTOR INTERVENTIONS

FOOD SECURITY & LIVELIHOOD (FSL)

Access to food shapes stability at the most immediate level.

In 2025, food security interventions across communities served by Mercy Without Limits were designed to address both immediate nutritional needs and the broader conditions that affect access to food over time.

Programs combined direct food assistance with livelihood support, ensuring that responses not only meet urgent demand but also contribute to longer-term resilience.

By supporting both access and production, food security programs contribute to conditions where stability can gradually be restored; the integrated approach allowing communities to move from dependence toward greater self-sufficiency.

MULTISECTOR INTERVENTIONS

WASH (WATER, SANITATION & HYGIENE)

Reliable access to water and sanitation defines how daily life functions, and disruptions affect not only health, but the overall stability of communities.

In 2025, WASH interventions focused on restoring and maintaining these essential systems. The work extended beyond distribution to include infrastructure development, system rehabilitation, and operational support, forming a foundation upon which other aspects of daily life depend.

SHELTER & NON FOOD ITEMS

In contexts affected by displacement, instability, and harsh seasonal conditions, provision of shelter support is critical for the foundation of privacy, protection, and the ability to manage daily life with greater dignity.

In 2025, Mercy Without Limits supported vulnerable households through shelter solutions, winter assistance, non-food items, and rehabilitation works that helped restore basic living conditions.

HEALTHCARE

In 2025, Mercy Without Limits continued to support healthcare access through targeted interventions and in-kind medical contributions, helping communities receive care where systems remain under pressure.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Mercy Without Limits expanded both its operational reach and financial capacity in 2025. The organization’s total budget increased from **\$11 million to \$26 million**, reflecting a significant rise in program scale and implementation capacity.

This growth supported expanded operations across multiple countries and sectors, enabling MWL to reach **8 million** beneficiaries through **167 projects**.



The 2025 financial growth translated into broader reach, stronger sector coverage, and increased capacity to respond to urgent and sustained needs.

Every contribution entrusted to MWL carries a responsibility: to reach further, serve better, and remain accountable to those who give and those who receive.

ALHASSAN - DRAWING HIS WAY BACK TO HOPE



COUNTRY: Sierra Leone



SECTOR: Protection & Orphan Support



CHALLENGE

After losing his father at a young age, Alhassan struggled to process grief and understand the sudden absence that changed daily life for his family. The loss left a deep emotional impact during his early childhood years.



MWL INTERVENTION

Through Mercy Without Limits' orphan support program, Alhassan participates in structured weekend activities designed to support emotional well-being and personal development. This includes coloring sessions, creative engagement activities, and Quran recitation lessons that provide routine, guidance, and a supportive environment.



WHAT CHANGED

The activities became a safe space where Alhassan could express himself, rebuild confidence, and reconnect with a sense of normalcy. Through drawing, learning, and group participation, he continues to find comfort, structure, and hope for the future.

STORIES OF IMPACT



WALAA, AHMAD & ALI - A HOME HELD BACK TOGETHER WITH CARE



COUNTRY: Lebanon



SECTOR: Orphan Support



CHALLENGE

After the loss of their father, Walaa, Ahmad, and Ali were left without the family's primary source of income and support. Living with their mother in Akkar, the family faced increasing difficulty covering everyday household needs while navigating a period of emotional and financial uncertainty.



MWL INTERVENTION

Mercy Without Limits provided monthly support to help stabilize the household and reduce immediate financial pressure on the family. The support also helped the children's mother prepare for additional seasonal expenses linked to school and Eid.



WHAT CHANGED

The assistance allowed the family to maintain greater stability during a difficult period. With essential needs more manageable, the children experienced a more secure environment, while their mother regained a sense of reassurance and relief as Eid and the school season approached.

STORIES OF IMPACT



CHALLENGE

Mahmoud, 14, lost his father in an airstrike and was displaced with his family to a camp in northwest Syria. Injuries from an explosion caused permanent damage to his hand and jaw, leaving him unable to properly hold a pen or continue learning. Isolation, physical trauma, and interrupted education gradually pushed him away from both school and social life.

Faten, 9, also lost access to education after her mother could no longer afford school supplies following the loss of her father. Watching other children return to school each morning became a painful reminder of what she was missing.



MWL INTERVENTION

Mercy Without Limits conducted a full assessment of Mahmoud's condition and facilitated medical surgeries, rehabilitation support, psychosocial care, educational follow-up, and caregiver support sessions. He was also provided with school supplies and assistance to re-enter learning.

Through the "Back to School" campaign, Faten received a school bag and educational supplies that enabled her return to the classroom.



WHAT CHANGED

Mahmoud gradually regained mobility, reconnected with education, and began rebuilding confidence after years of withdrawal and isolation. His reintegration into learning became part of a broader process of emotional and physical recovery.

For Faten, returning to school restored a sense of joy, participation, and belonging. Her renewed confidence quickly reflected in the classroom, where she became actively engaged in learning once again.
